Family Life Center

Bethany Living and Sharing God's Love

One of the great blessings of being a pastor is being able to see God's people live as God's people on a daily basis. Whether it is the staff working throughout the week or people helping with Family Promise or volunteers serving as Care Warriors, Stephen Ministers, Sunday School teachers, quilt, coffee, or meal makers, or any other of a number of things done around Bethany, seeing people Live and Share God's Love is encouraging and exciting to see, especially when it comes to helping those who are in need. Because helping those who are hungry or homeless or suffering from other needs in this world is simply not optional for the disciple of Christ.

This love that helps those who are in need, is in many ways, the essence of who we are. To be clear, loving others in this way, or any good work for that matter, does not forgive our sins, reconcile us to God, or give eternal life. Those things are only done through faith in Christ. However, with that faith, a Christian should be motivated to do all sorts of good things, including helping others where and when we can.

Rev. Matthew Harrison, the President of our synod (the Lutheran Church - Missouri Synod) explains all of this in an essay he wrote in the book, The Mercy of God in the Cross of Christ. In the essay, titled Theology for Mercy, President Harrison said that Jesus Christ came into this world to have mercy on us and all sinners (Hebrews 2:17). Our love for others is then driven by this love of God. He goes on to mention how Scripture and our Lutheran Confessions point out that our love for others is an assumed reality in the church's life together. That is, local congregations should be rich with works of love for both the congregation's own members, and those outside of the congregation. It is true that in both the Old and New Testaments we see a priority being placed on caring for those who are in need inside of the local congregation. However, this does exclude people from other churches, denominations, or even people of different faiths.

Therefore, President Harrison writes that a Christian congregation can and should work with other entities (whether churches, societies, Lutheran, Christian, or not) in meeting human need. This is often referred to as "cooperating in externals," that is working with others towards a common goal that does not require or imply church fellowship or worshipping together. Doing so will not only help a congregation meet the needs of more people than they could by themselves, but also when done with other Christians, be a powerful witness of the unity of the Body of Christ in the world. President Harrison also suggests that when members of the LCMS "cooperate in externals" with other Christians, there is an opportunity to maintain the correct teaching and application of God's Word. This not only glorifies God, but can also be a positive contribution in bringing churches together.

With all of this in mind, our congregation is considering working with a new organization in Cedar Rapids called Love INC (In the Name of Christ). Like Bethany, Love INC recognizes there are many people who are in need in our area and that by themselves, no local congregation (Lutheran or otherwise) would be able to help as many of those people as if we worked together. Therefore, Love INC wants to help organize churches so that we can help meet more of those needs as we partner with one another.

To find out more about Love INC and how Bethany can work with them to *Live and Share God's Love*, our Church Council has invited them to come to Bethany to give a presentation on their work and their plans for our area. This will take place on Sunday, March 1 during the Education Hour (9:45 a.m.) in the Family Life Center. I would like to encourage everyone in the congregation to plan on attending this meeting. This is not only to learn more about this organization, but also to gather information so that together as God's people we may discern if working with Love INC is how God wants us to live. While there, you may also feel that God is leading you to use your gifts to help with this problem in our area as an individual.

Whatever the case may be, I continue to be excited and encouraged to see our congregation live as God's people. And I look forward to seeing everyone on March 1st to see how we can Live and Share God's love in the future!


Pastor's Thoughts on the March Readings

As we begin the month of March, congratulations to everyone who has been keeping up on reading the Daily Lectionary as part of their devotional life in Christ. And for those who may have fallen a little behind over the last two months, it's all right! Reading Scripture is supposed to be a blessing, not a chore. Just pick up where you left off or skip what you have missed and continue on with the plan.

Speaking of the plan, March begins as we continue in the book of Numbers that we began in February. The chapters we read in March pick up the story with the people of Israel at Kadesh, beginning with their rebellion. There are various pictures of Jesus in Numbers, especially the faith in the one lifted up on the pole (21:4-9). See how Jesus in St. John's Gospel account explains His fulfillment of the prophecy of the "lifting up" episode (John 3:14-15; 8:28).

On March 8th we begin the final book of the Pentateuch, Deuteronomy. The book of Deuteronomy presents Moses' farewell sermon to the people of Israel as they stand in Moab at the Jordan River preparing to enter the Promised Land. The sermon is part of God and the people renewing the covenant, and thus it repeats much of the law given earlier. In this sense, Deuteronomy is a repetition or copy of the law, as its name suggests. Pay special attention to the similarities between Moses and Jesus, and likewise note in chapter 18 Moses' direct prophecy of Jesus, "The Prophet" raised up from among His brothers, and notice how in the New Testament some apply that passage to Jesus (for example, John 7:40).

On March 19th we begin to read from St. Luke's Gospel account, which may be a welcome New Testament break after reading through the entire Pentateuch in the preceding two months. Luke, a physician writing an orderly account to Theophilus so that he may know with certainty the things he has been taught, helps us see the completeness and universal availability of God's grace and the table fellowship that believing sinners have with Jesus. St. Luke's account includes more detail about Jesus' birth than the other Gospel accounts, and it is thought that perhaps the Holy Spirit used the Virgin Mary herself as one of St. Luke's sources for those details.


