So Jesus said to the Jews who had believed him, "If you abide in my word, you are truly my disciples, 32 and you will know the truth, and the truth will set you free." - John 8:31-32

The verses above are part of the appointed readings for Reformation Day from the Gospel of John. In them, Jesus is reminding some of the Jewish people who had believed His teachings the importance of staying in His Word. For this reason, I would like every disciple of Christ who is a member of Bethany to participate in our congregation's upcoming reading of the Daily Lectionary, beginning on December 1st. Simply put, the Daily Lectionary is a devotional reading plan that covers the entire Sacred Scriptures each year with all the Psalms being read twice. The selections are based on ancient models and are generally in harmony with the liturgical church year, with the average reading being three chapters daily. A seasonal canticle is assigned for each month and is scheduled to replace the psalm on the first and last days of the month.

In addition to reading the Scriptures however, those participating in reading the Daily Lectionary will also be asked to be part of Bethany's Small Group ministry. Many of the benefits of Small Groups will be highlighted by Amanda Segebart on page 9 of this month's Beacon. But St. Paul, writing to Titus, encourages him to teach the Biblical truth of salvation by grace through faith and then adds, "The saying is trustworthy, and I want you to insist on these things, so that those who have believed in God may be careful to devote themselves to good works. These things are excellent and profitable for people" [Titus 3:8]. An emphasis of these small groups therefore will not only be to discuss the Scripture that we have read, but also to devote ourselves to good works together. Christians sometimes forget that our "devotional lives", according to Paul, should not only include studying God's Word (an absolute necessity), but also good works that are just as important. These good works in Small Groups could be anything that is profitable for others such as: making quilts for Lutheran World Relief, hosting a meal for Family Promise, volunteering at a charity 5K race, giving rides to health care appointments, or picking up trash in God's creation. The possibilities are limitless and I'll be excited to see what good works God's people find themselves being motivated to do by God's Word!

Now, I understand that as you consider committing yourself to receiving God's blessings through His Word, some may say they simply do not have enough time to read three chapters of the

Bible every day. In response I would suggest that a dynamic reading of God's Word is not optional for a Christian. Jesus invites His disciples to center our lives on Scripture and not simply fit His Word into them when it is convenient. As I myself plan on reading the Daily Lectionary, I'm quite confident that I will be able to find this time to read Scriptures simply by turning off many of the electronic distractions that invade our lives for a few minutes each day. Also remember, that reading and studying Scripture is meant to be a blessing, not a burden. If you should happen to "miss" a day or two, relax and live in God's grace! Pick up where you left off and God will still have many blessings for you.

Also, I am grateful that many of you are already active in the Word of God. To you I would suggest, "If it ain't broke, don't fix it!" Rather than doing something different, if your study of Scripture is already working for you, keep doing it and give thanks to God for the blessings you've received. However, I would still like to encourage you to take what God has taught you in His Word and be part of a Small Group that will devote themselves to good works.

With all of this in mind, throughout the month of November we will be asking people to "sign-up" to participate in reading through the Daily Lectionary. While the assigned readings each month will be widely available in many ways, this will ensure that everyone will have access to them. In addition, while we will not force anyone into a group, Ronda Anderson and I will be using the list of people who have signed up to help organize people into Small Groups with others that may share an interest in doing particular types of good works.

As questions or suggestions arise, please feel free to reach out to me. And if the Holy Spirit is moving your heart to participate in Bethany's reading of Scripture for the next year, please let us know sometime during this month.



## Benefits of Small Groups Focused on God's Word

God did not create us to live in isolation from one another or never intended Christianity to be a "me, God, and my Bible" lifestyle. The Bible teaches that we *need* each other for many reasons: *For just as the body is one and has many members, and all the members of the body, though many, are one body, so it is with Christ… If all were a single member, where would the body be? As it is, there are many parts, yet one body.* 

- I Corinthians 12:12 & 19-20

Creating small groups, outside of large group gatherings, helps to build discipleship and greater connection with the Body of Christ. Over the years, there has been a ton of research done on the importance and benefits of small group study. Here are just a few:

An Increase in Spiritual Growth – Fellow Christians help us observe the important aspects of a Bible passage and interpret them correctly. We need others to help us see what is true in the Bible—to sharpen, clarify, and correct what we think. As Proverbs 27:17 says *'Iron sharpens iron, and one man sharpens another.''* 

An Increase in Accountability. – We all have good intentions to stick with Bible study plans at home, yet distractions provide one reason after another to postpone. Small group study members double as accountability partners. When we're tempted to let other things get in the way, a phone call or text saying, "We missed you," motivates us to stay on track.

An Increase in Serving – Small groups create an outlet for ministry, planning and serving the community together with the unique interests, talents, and abilities that God has given to them.

Encouragement – Paul teaches us that when we see the faith in another believer, it encourages us in our own faith (Romans 1:12). Through small groups, God can orchestrate relationships and brings us the right person to encourage us.

Therefore, throughout the month of December, Bethany is encouraging all of our members to sign up and participate in our small group ministry that is focused on God's Word motivating us to good works. You can do this at the church or if you have any questions you may contact Parish Nurse Ronda Anderson.


