# Service at Bethany STARTING JUNE 14

So that we may safely gather to receive God's blessings through His Word and Sacraments, we will be instituting the following procedures for our June 14 and June 21 services.

- 1. On each day there will be one service at 9:00 a.m. Holy Communion will be celebrated both Sundays. The service on June 14 will be an abbreviated form of our traditional service, and on June 21 we will have an abbreviated form of our contemporary service.
- 2. Attendance will be limited to 50 people (the estimated number of worshippers that may safely gather in the sanctuary) and seats will be assigned beforehand to ensure both proper social distancing and having the maximum number of people able to attend.
  - a. Therefore, those desiring to attend the service on June 14 will be required to sign up during the week of June 8-12. A link to SignUp Genius will be emailed, or you may call the church office at 364-6026 to sign up. Those desiring to attend the service on June 21 are asked to sign up the week of June 15-19 in the same manner. A "waiting list" will be started should we reach the maximum number of worshippers for either service.
- 3. Those who are over the age of 65, have medical conditions that increase their risk of infection or complications, are feeling ill, or have been recently exposed to someone who has tested positive for COVID-19 are asked to strongly consider waiting to worship with us another Sunday.
- 4. A mask that covers your nose and mouth must be worn in the church. If you do not have a mask, there will be a limited number of masks available for you at the church. Attendees are also asked to keep 6 feet away from people not in their family group and to make use of the available hand sanitizer.
- 5. Congregation members will not sing during the service. However, there will be limited responses in the liturgy including the Nicene Creed and the Lord's Prayer.

- 6. The Distribution during Holy Communion will take place in the following manner:
  - a. After I give the greeting, ("Welcome to the table of our Lord.") everyone will be seated.
  - b. An usher will invite the first family group to go to the altar. At this point, everyone else will remain seated.
  - c. Upon being invited by the usher, each family group will approach the altar by walking down the center aisle, meeting me at the altar rail on their side of the sanctuary. Communicants are asked to remain standing and to keep their masks on until they have received the sacrament.
  - d. After receiving the sacrament, communicants will return to their seats via the side aisle and dispose of their communion cups in the receptacles placed along the wall.
  - e. When it is safe to do so, the usher will invite the next family group to come forward. This process will repeat itself until everyone has received the sacrament.
- 7. Offering plates will not be passed during the service. Tithes and offerings may be placed in the offering plates located in the back of the sanctuary or worshippers may use one of Bethany's electronic giving options.
- 8. At the end of the service I will dismiss each family group, starting in the back and working our way forward.
- 9. There will be no coffee, doughnuts, or Sunday School after the service. While discouraged, if worshipers desire to "mingle" after service, they will be asked to do so outside of the building, while keeping a safe distance from each other.
- 10. I will lead an online Zoom Bible Study that Sunday at 10:30 a.m.
- 11. Those who have signed up to attend will receive an email or phone call on the Saturday before with their "seat assignments." Please note that each pew has a number (odd on the north [pulpit] side) and each pew has been divided into three color coded sections (see the sample chart on page 10). It is important that each family group not only sit in the correct pew, but also the correct section in that pew to maintain proper distance and maximize the number of people who may attend.
- 12. After the services on June 14 and June 21 have been evaluated by Bethany's leadership, guidelines for following services and our voters' meeting on June 28 will be released on our website, social media platforms, and Pastor's weekly update.
- 13. Parish Nurse Ronda Anderson, music leaders, the Board of Elders, and myself will continue to monitor the situation and receive input from other congregation members. If the need arises, last minute changes may be made including the postponing or cancelling of services.
- 14. As service attendance will be limited to 50 people or fewer, we will continue to provide service resources for people access from home. This way, everyone will still have the opportunity to worship and hear the message.

While this may seem like a lot of information about new practices, the congregation's leadership would like to thank everyone in advance for their understanding and willingness to adapt during these difficult times. While I believe we are all praying that Sundays at Bethany will not look like what we have outlined above for very long (no singing, no Bible Study, no doughnuts or coffee!), I do hope that we are all still able to recognize how God blesses us in whatever manner we gather as long as His Word and Sacraments are present.

#### Pastor's Thoughts on the Lectionary

Now about halfway through the Church Year, in June we complete our first run through the Psalms and begin the second. Specific psalms to give special attention to this month are Psalm 1 (about the two "ways" or paths), Psalm 2 (quoted frequently by the New Testament and applied to Christ), Psalm 22 (from which Jesus Himself quotes while on the cross), and Psalm 23 (to be related to Jesus' self-identification as the Good Shepherd in John 10).


In the beginning of June, we also finish the book of Acts. We pick up the story of the spread of the Church after Jesus' ascension with the account of the Jerusalem conference, which took place after St. Paul's first missionary journey (chapter 15), and we follow his second and third journeys and the unexpected way he got to Rome. (See Romans itself for St. Paul's expressing his desire to get there.)

On the 8th of June, we return to the Old Testament. Picking up where Moses left off in Deuteronomy, the book of Joshua details the conquest and fulfillment of God working through the people of Israel in the Promised Land. Joshua himself is a living prophecy of the God-man with the same Hebrew name, whom we know as Jesus. Interestingly, it may have been a pre-incarnate Jesus who makes a brief appearance in this book, and the book also tells of one of Jesus' ancestors, and it may surprise you who it is!

From June 14-June 20 we read Judges. The book of Judges, which word also means "leaders," tells of the days after Joshua died and again shows God's gracious provision of spiritual and political deliverers. Take special note of the cycle of disobedience and apostasy, foreign oppression, cries of distress, and deliverance. The people were faithless, but God was faithful. The events can be strikingly similar to our time in that "everyone did what was right in his own eyes" (Judges 17:6).

On June 21, we read Ruth. The book of Ruth is in sharp contrast to the accounts of the book of Judges, though set at the same time. This book tells more about the ancestry of David and thus also Jesus, but more importantly it shows us salvation is by faith and that deliverance comes from our Redeemer. Ruth 1:16-17 is frequently used as a wedding text, but note how its context is not that of a wedding, though there are weddings in the book of Ruth.

Finally, on June 22, we continue in canonical and chronological order with 1 Samuel. Samuel, too, is a living prophecy of Jesus in that he was prophet, priest, and "king," even before there was a king. Samuel on God's behalf anointed Israel's first two kings and was instrumental in establishing the kingship as God's service. In June we read only as far as chapter 27; the ending of Saul's and the beginning of David's kingship will have to wait until July!


#### Study Opportunities for Women & Men

#### Questions & Answers about electronic giving

#### Do I have to set up an account?

Setting up an account is encouraged! You don't have to set up an account; however, the advantage is that you can always go back to the account and see your electronic offering history, confirm a contribution, or make another contribution without having to re-enter all of your information. Each time you enter contributions as a guest the system will create a new customer number for you. Look for the Instructions on the website just click on (instructions here).

#### Is the website electronic giving secure?

Yes, our electronic giving system is secure. The giving page on our website is a link to our vendor's secure website where the transaction takes place.

#### When I made a contribution on the Bethany website why I didn't get a confirmation email?

The email is sent when your payment is processed. The electronic payments from a checking or savings account take two days to process, so you will not get an email right away. You can print the confirmation page from your computer screen if you want. Debit and Credit card contributions are immediate, therefore an email is generated right away. You must enter an email address to get a receipt sent to you.

**Offering Envelopes:** You can mail your giving envelopes to the church office. They are deposited weekly.
