Members and Friends of Bethany,

As summer begins to wind down in the midst of the pandemic, our congregation faces both challenges and opportunities that will be addressed by our leadership in the future, and some of which are described in this issue of the Beacon. And while there is much uncertainty in the world today, we can say with confidence that having been blessed by God and the faithfulness of His people at Bethany, we will continue to Live and Share God's Love as we are guided by the Holy Spirit. With this confidence and gratitude, I'd like to share the following thoughts from our Synod's stewardship ministry as we move towards the Fall...

"Good Teacher, what must I do to inherit eternal life?" asked the rich young ruler. Jesus said, "You know the commandments." And the ruler replied, "All these I have kept from my youth." And Jesus said to him, "One thing you still lack. Sell all that you have and distribute to the poor, and you will have treasure in heaven; and come, follow me." (Luke 18:18–22)

As we listen to this, one question is raised in our minds: Is Jesus speaking to us also or only to the rich young ruler? In other words, is Jesus telling us to sell all that we have and give it to the poor? As good Lutherans, we answer: No! But why? Why should we not sell all that we have and distribute it to the poor?

The simplest explanation is this: If we sold everything we have, our wife and our children would be neglected. In other words, to sell everything we have and give it to the poor would ignore, even abandon, those whom God has placed in our care. Our money, everything we have, is not to be used solely for the church. But that doesn't mean it isn't to be used for the purpose God intends.

Everyone has three stations in life, three spheres in which we live and are to be of service to our neighbors. These stations are the church, the family, and society. We are members of all three of these by birth.

- We are born into the church by water and the Word of God, and our duties to others in the church arise from either our birth into the church or the birth of others by Baptism into it.
- We are born into a family, and our duties to others stem from either our birth into that family or the birth of others into our family.

• Finally, we are born into society, which is simply a further extension of our birth into our family. The duties we have toward other members of society come from either our birth or the birth of others into the same society.

All that we have and all that we are is to be pressed into service for the church, the family, and society. If we were to sell all we have and give only to one, the other two would be neglected, and our duties toward them would falter.

So consider your life and all that you have in light of these three stations. You pay taxes to support and help those in society. You provide food, clothing, and shelter for the members of your family. You save for college for your children.

But the one station that is usually thought of last is the church. Since the needs of the family and society are more immediate, the church is often given what is left over. This is not how it should be. Rather, we are to give of our first fruits – the best from off the top – even as Abel gave the best of his flock.

This requires forethought and intent. It means that you sit down and make a plan for what you will give from the beginning. It means sticking to it even when it seems there are other more immediate and pressing things.

This is all the more necessary now as we enter into periods of time while giving is low due to high unemployment or restrictions on meeting in church to give. If we love God, his gifts of forgiveness given through the means of grace we receive at church and only at church, then we will support the church just as we love our country and our family.

For all that we have and all that we are is given to us by our gracious and giving God. He spared no expense for us and our salvation. He gave up His Son into death so that our sins are forgiven, and we will live. What is more, He provides for all that we need for this body and life. And our lives in this world, among these three spheres of the church, the family, and society, are to mirror the generosity of the one who gave us life in all three by birth.

## Pastor's Thoughts on the Lectionary


We begin August by continuing to read II Chronicles, which details the reign of Solomon and summarizes the reigns of Judah's other kings through to Judah's exile in Babylon and promised return. Solomon is another type of Jesus, as Solomon's temple also is fulfilled in Jesus.

One of the more faithful kings after Solomon was Hezekiah, whose notable reformation the divinely-inspired Chronicler details (beginning in II Chronicles 29). Hezekiah not only focused on physically cleaning the House of the Lord, but he also restored the service of the House of the Lord, making provisions for music, worship, and the sacred meal, as did the 16th-century Lutheran Reformation, focusing primarily on God's service to us.

On August 13-18, we continue reading "the Writings" by taking up the books of Ezra and Nehemiah, which continue the historical account where Chronicles left off. These two books from the Bible were originally treated as one and may have been authored by the same person as Chronicles. It is generally thought that Ezra arrived in Jerusalem first (and rebuilt the Temple) and was later joined by Nehemiah (who rebuilt the city's wall). Both books show how God fulfills His gracious promise to the people by returning them from exile (as He delivers us from sin). We also see the importance of preserving the Israelites' genealogy as they await the Messiah, coming through a specific family line.

August 19-21 we read Esther. Esther was a Jewish woman who became queen of Persia. Though we read her book after Ezra-Nehemiah, she likely reigned before their time. She exhibits Christ-like qualities in being willing to die for her people and advocating on their behalf. This account gives the background for the annual Jewish festival of Purim, a festival of God's faithfulness to His people. God's faithful and gracious preservation of His people in the face of danger and opposition is readily apparent in Esther, and we should remember God's promise to likewise always preserve us.

August 22 through the month's end we read the first part of Job, which is included in a subcategory of the "Writings", the Wisdom literature. The events of this book likely took place long before Esther, while the people lived under judges (before the reign of the kings), though possibly the events were not recorded until much later. As with I and II Samuel, the name of the book does not refer to its author (who is unknown) but to its central character. The book of Job shows how God uses suffering to test and teach us. As Job asks his wife, "Shall we receive good from God, and shall we not receive evil?" (Job 2:10), we are reminded that all things are truly in God's control.

Contact the church office if you plan to attend so we can send you the Zoom link. You may order your book on Amazon, or contact the church office if you need us to order your book.



# GIVE PLUS Automatic Giving

For those who would like to participate in an electronic giving option without using the website or App you can simply fill out the Give Plus Authorization form. Electronic giving allows you to make donations on a scheduled, automatic basis. You can eliminate writing checks and preparing envelopes. It is convenient for you and provides giving consistency for our church.

#### How to get started

To set up electronic offering, simply complete the authorization form and return it to the church. Your gifts can be debited automatically from either a checking or savings account.

You can request offering envelopes that can be used for special services throughout the year. You can also put the empty envelope in the collection plate during services as we know that the symbolic act of giving is an important part of church services.

Once the authorization form has been processed you will be contacted to confirm that your electronic giving has been set up. Your authorization form can be changed or cancelled anytime throughout the year.
