[Jesus] was delivered up for our trespasses and raised for our justification. – Romans 4:25

As Christians around the world prepare to celebrate the resurrection of our Lord this April 4th, it seems that we all know this is a special time of year. Even while the world continues to struggle with the pandemic; even while our community recovers from the derecho; even while we all feel the effects of living in a world that has been ruined by sin – Easter always has been and always will be a time of celebration and great joy. But I often wonder if people know the real reason behind our Easter joy.

It's easy to see that if Easter simply means the arrival of Spring and looking for baskets and eggs filled with candy, a person doesn't really know the true joy of Easter. Sadly, this is all that Easter is for some who think of themselves as Christians, and for many who don't believe in Jesus at all. Such people find that their joy quickly fades away as Spring gives way to Summer and Fall and that their Easter candy disappears even faster!

However, there are many in the Church, well acquainted with God's Word and the doctrine that we learn from it, who also miss the complete joy of Easter. Such people might know that the resurrection of Jesus is important and comforting because it proves that: Christ is the Son of God (Romans 1:4); Jesus' teachings are true (John 2:19); and that all believers will rise to eternal life (John 14:19). Now of course, God's Word certainly identifies all of these as blessed fruits of Jesus' resurrection. And yet, there must be something more for us to have all of the joy of Easter. For the voice from Heaven at Jesus' baptism told us that Jesus is the Son of God (Mark 1:11). Jesus' miracles of healing and power revealed not only His divinity but also that His teachings were true (John 2:23). And the resurrection of Lazarus, the son of the widow of Nain, and Jairus' daughter all firmly establish the immortality of our soul and the resurrection of our bodies.

The true source of our Easter joy is therefore something completely different. The points above are all most definitely true, but they are nothing more than the frame around the real picture. For the true joy of Easter lies in Christ's work of redemption and salvation. St. Paul clearly writes, "And if Christ has not been raised, your faith is futile and you are still in your sins" (I Corinthians 15:17). C.F.W. Walther writes that from this we see that Christ's resurrection is not simply a stone in the building of our salvation, it is the keystone to that building. The resurrection of Jesus is not just a shining jewel in the crown of our salvation, it is the entire crown itself! Simply put, without the resurrection of Jesus the world would not be saved and we would still be lost in our sin.

But Christ has risen, and we are saved from our sin and look forward to life with God that will last forever and be completely void of sin and evil! The anticipation of this eternal life changes the way in which we live in this life right now. In the midst of a deadly pandemic, we can have hope for the future. In the midst of seeing our homes and neighborhoods damaged or destroyed, we know our heavenly home is secure and waiting. The guilt over past sins has been taken away and we are strengthened to serve God and one another in the future. As God's holy and redeemed people, we are able to live in this moment with the joy of Jesus' resurrection.

I hope that as you read this month's Beacon, you will see the many effects of Jesus' rising from the grave here at Bethany. And as the Spirit desires, together we will not only heed His call to celebrate the resurrection, but also share its joy with our family, friends, and communities.




Christian Faith Class

Thursday Morning Bible Study



Upcoming Adjustments to Covid Safety Procedures

Brothers and Sisters in Christ,

The current Covid-19 pandemic has been disruptive to all of our lives in many ways, most tragically through the deaths of over 540,000 of our fellow Americans. And while the virus continues to pose a serious threat to many people's health and well-being, there has been good news for all those wanting to get back to some sense of normalcy. New cases, hospitalizations, and deaths from the virus have dropped significantly and the rate and number of vaccinations continue to rise. While we are far from being "out of the woods," it does seem that it is appropriate for Bethany to change a few of our Covid safety procedures to reflect the progress being made.

Therefore, Bethany plans to start singing again in our worship services on Pentecost (May 23). This date has been picked for three reasons: First, it will allow more time for those who desire to be vaccinated to receive the vaccination. Second, this will give us a chance to see if some of the variants of the virus will lead to another spike in cases. And third, we need time to inform the congregation of changes, reducing the number of people who may be surprised when they show up for worship. For the time being, we are planning on everyone continuing to wear masks during the worship service. We will also have an area of the church (most likely the Gathering Area) that will have the service live-streamed for those who wish to attend, yet are still not be comfortable being in the sanctuary with people singing.

I'm also happy to say that we are currently planning on a variety of ministries and programs returning and starting at Bethany as well. While exact dates and details still need to be worked out, you can soon look forward to more in-person Bible Studies, youth activities, a tree planting ministry, and of course coffee and treats between Sunday services, just to name a few.

As noted above, while the virus has affected some more than others, we all have been affected, including our congregation. But as I have said since the beginning of this pandemic, we will act with caution and guided by the recommendations of the proper authorities, not out of fear or the lack of faith in God's protection, but out of love for our neighbor, our community, and each other. If people who believe they have been freely justified by God's grace through faith in Christ cannot sacrifice for the good of others, I don't know who will. And regardless of where we are in the current pandemic, I believe we can all agree that this type of love is Christ-like, God-pleasing, and always needed.
