Motivated only by the Gospel, guided only by God's Law, and using the gifts of time, talent, and treasure that He has entrusted us with, it is the intention of Bethany Lutheran Church to help those who are hungry and face food insecurity in our area. We believe this can be done by establishing and operating what will be known as the Bethany Lutheran Food Pantry.

BUT YOU WILL RECEIVE POWER WHEN THE HOLY SPIRIT HAS COME UPON YOU, AND YOU WILL BE MY WITNESSES IN JERUSALEM AND IN ALL JUDEA AND SAMARIA, AND TO THE END OF THE EARTH. ACTS 1:8

In addition to serving those in need, God's Word makes it clear that we are to be His witnesses to the end of the earth. While starting a food pantry will be a way to reach people in our community, we would also like to reach people around the globe. Each of us might not be able to travel around the world, but what we can do is support the mission work that is already happening. Missionaries are in need of our support through fervent prayer and financial giving.

The Board of Evangelism has selected a mission of schools in Kenya for our congregation to support. This mission of the Lutheran Church Missouri Synod equips students with the Word of God. Bethany members are encouraged to prayerfully consider how you can be witnesses to the end of the earth through support of the Bethany Lutheran Food Pantry and the mission schools in Kenya. And divided tongues as of fire appeared to them and rested on each one of them. And they were all filled with the Holy Spirit and began to speak in other tongues as the Spirit gave them utterance. - Acts 2:3-4

This year Christians will celebrate the Feast of Pentecost on May 23. The word *Pentecost* comes from the Greek language, meaning "fiftieth." The Jewish festival of Pentecost (or Weeks) falls on the fiftieth day after Passover and commemorates God giving the Law to Moses on Mt. Sinai. For Christians, Pentecost falls on the fiftieth day (seventh Sunday) after Jesus' resurrection and celebrates the coming of the Holy Spirit upon the disciples. As they began to speak in languages from around the Mediterranean world, 3000 people believed and were baptized, which is why Pentecost is often referred to as the birthday of the Christian Church.

Of course, the effects of the first Pentecost went beyond thousands of new Christians. For by this outpouring of the Holy Spirit upon the disciples, Jesus Himself revealed to the whole world that He is truly risen from the dead and has ascended into heaven where He rules as God and Man at the right hand of the Father. For the disciples, this not only equipped them to do the amazing things we read of in the New Testament, but it also transformed their fear and weakness into heroic faith and courage. Their doubts were changed into revealed knowledge. Fishermen, a tax collector, and the other disciples became teachers and Jesus' representatives to all the people of the world!

However, as glorious as these events of the first Pentecost are, and while they are something that all Christians should be thankful for, we would do ourselves a disservice if we only remembered and focused on the events of the past on Pentecost. For the same thing that happened to the apostles, also happens to us. It is true that the apostles were endowed on that first Pentecost with extraordinary gifts of the Holy Spirit that were necessary for the tasks that they alone would face. Nevertheless, all Christians share in the main gift the apostles re-

ceived that day – the gift of the Holy Spirit Himself. And just as the Spirit transformed the lives of the apostles, so too are the lives of all people changed through the Spirit working through the Word and Sacraments today.

As you read through this month's Beacon you'll find many ways that the Spirit continues to work through the church and our congregation. But this month there are two ministries in particular that I would like to bring to your attention. The first is our congregation's support of Christ's Care for Children in Kenya. This ministry provides lodging, meals, medical care, scholastic tutoring, and most importantly - the Gospel of Jesus, to children in Kenya. Everyone is invited to find out more about Bethany's involvement in this ministry by attending our Kenyan Mission Kickoff on May 23 (Pentecost) at 9:45 a.m. The second ministry is the start of the Bethany Lutheran Food Pantry that will provide assistance to anyone in our area who is struggling with food insecurity. While more information is inside this edition of the Beacon, this ministry of our congregation plans to be open on Sunday afternoons to share "daily bread" and God's love with everyone from children to senior citizens.

These ministries, as well as others at Bethany and the tasks that we face in life as God's people, can seem daunting and are no small undertaking. But this is why we remember Pentecost. For just as the Spirit equipped and transformed the apostles with the His gifts, so too has the Spirit called us to faith and equipped us for service to our Lord and the people He brings into our care.




Quilts for World Relief
