
Bethany Beacon MARCH 2022 Witnesses to Christ

This Lent, join us for the series "Witnesses to Christ" at our midweek Lenten services.



John tells us why he wrote his Gospel: "Jesus did many other signs in the presence of the disciples, which are not written in this book; but these are written so that you may believe that Jesus is the Christ, the Son of God, and that by believing you may have life in His name" (John 20:30–31). Life! When we believe that Jesus is the Christ, God gives us life—abundant life, forgiven life, and eternal life.

Historically, the Fourth Gospel is likened to an eagle an image that suggests John soars to heights of glory and grandeur. That's because the evangelist paints a stunning portrait of Jesus, who is the bread of life, the resurrection and the life, and the way, the truth, and the life. Life in Jesus. That's God's gift to you!

This Lent, our life in Christ will be strengthened as we hear the witness of those in John's Gospel who journeyed to the cross. Along the way, we'll meet villains, such as Barabbas and Pontius Pilate, as well as sinners, such as Peter (who denied Jesus *three* times), Mary Magdalene (who was possessed by *seven* demons), and Judas Iscariot (who betrayed Jesus for *thirty* pieces of silver).

And as for what fell among the thorns, they are those who hear, but as they go on their way they are choked by the cares and riches and pleasures of life... – Luke 8:14

Most Christians recognize that the resurrection of Jesus is the chief event, not only in the life of Christ, but also in our lives of faith. Therefore, this saving event is the focus of the church's greatest feast of the year – Easter. However, from very early on Christians recognized the value of having a solemn time of preparation before celebrating the joy of Easter. This time of preparation became known as *Lent*, from the Latin word meaning "spring".

While definitive evidence of Lent being observed through fasting dates back to the 4th century, it is Pope Leo the Great in the 5th century, (not to be confused with indulgence granting Pope Leo X of Luther's time), who encourages increasing other spiritual disciplines during Lent as well. He wrote, "Lent was appointed to prepare souls for a fruitful commemoration of the mystery of Easter; as a time of inner purification and sanctification, of penance of sins past, of breaking off of sinful habits, of the exercise of virtues, especially almsgiving, reconciliation and the laying aside of enmity and hatred."

This year, the season of Lent begins on March 2. And as Christians have done for centuries, I would like all of us to consider observing this solemn season of the church, especially today as the threat of war looms over Europe and the world is still dealing with COVID and all of the consequences this pandemic has brought about over the last two years. What I mean by this is that while Lutherans have always focused their lives and faith on the Gospel of Christ, even during the Lenten season, we have also recognized the importance of evaluating how we live as Christians and making an effort to grow in our Christian lives of sanctification. As many of us face challenges and hardships in our personal lives and all of us face the uncertainties and fears that grip the entire world, our comfort is only found in the Gospel of our Lord. However, not only does the world need Christians to live as Christians now more than ever, but increasing our spiritual disciplines can also be a way for God to increase our hope and peace and defend us from evil.

One area of our spiritual lives in particular where this happens is in hearing God's Word and receiving the sacraments (the Means of Grace) during our church services. Of course, the pandemic over the last two years has created unique situations where many have not been able to safely attend church services. And in fact, there was a time early on in the pandemic where Bethany cancelled several weeks of Sunday services, even on Easter! However, our understanding of COVID has evolved over the years and we are now in a different place with vaccines and treatments. And while I in no way want to minimize the suffering that has taken place and continues to take place because of COVID, nor would I ever discourage anyone from listening to their doctors and other medical professionals, I am afraid that many are cutting themselves off from the Lord by not being in God's Word and receiving the Lord's Supper. Jesus' Parable of the Sower warns that even previously healthy seed with deep roots can be lost if the cares of the world overgrow it and choke it out.

To be perfectly clear, our Lord Jesus Christ understands that there are those who are simply unable to come to church due to medical conditions and other factors. For these people our congregation will continue working to bring the Word and Sacrament to where they are. However, for those who are able, I'd like to encourage them to use this season of Lent to grow in their lives of Christian living, especially hearing the Word and receiving the Lord's Supper at church. This is one of the reasons that in addition to our normal Sunday services during Lent, we also have our midweek services on Wednesday evenings, so that we might all grow together as the body of Christ by the Means of Grace and rejoice in the hope of the resurrection in all circumstances.

Congregation Assessment Tool: Participate in a Survey



As some of you may remember, several years ago Bethany spent a considerable amount of time and effort in clarifying the mission and vision of our congregation to help guide our congregation into the future. By God's grace that future has, in large part, come to be a reality in our congregation. Therefore, the staff and lay leadership at Bethany feels that now is a great time to go through that process again to ensure that we keep following our Lord on the path that He gives to us.

As we have done in the past, to begin this process the Church Council has decided to conduct a congregational assessment. This assessment will provide a clear picture of who we are as a church and what directions are most important for our future. The tool we'll use is the Congregation Assessment Tool (CAT) from Holy Cow, the same tool that we used in the Fall of 2014. This assessment will provide key indicators of our congregational health along with areas of challenge and potential growth. It will help us to collect and understand the range of views that exist at Bethany and the possibilities, willingness, capacity and energy for moving our ministry into the future.

If you have provided us with a current email address, within this month, you will receive a unique web link to complete the assessment online. If you would prefer to take the assessment using a paper copy, please stop by the office once the assessment has been released, and we will provide one for you along with a self-addressed stamped envelope.

Please note: If there is only one email address for all members of your household, it may be tempting to have one person take the survey on behalf of the family. However, please be sure your spouse and all young adults (16 years and older) living in your home have an opportunity to complete the survey. Individual input is key to our gaining insight into overall perceptions and experiences.

When taking the survey, please set aside enough time to answer all the questions. This will take about 40 minutes. Also, please remember that all survey responses are strictly anonymous.
