*Living and Sharing God's Love*

If the last two years have taught me anything, it is that the world can be a “not very nice place”. Of course, the wonders of God’s creation are always there and I always try to appreciate them. But for two years now the world, and all of us, have been dealing with the COVID-19 pandemic in one way or another. And if that global pandemic wasn’t enough to remind us that we live in a fallen world, Russia went ahead and decided to invade Ukraine a few weeks ago. At first this war may have seemed to be of little concern to most of us in the United States. (How many of us would have been able to locate Ukraine on a map or name its capital three months ago?) But very quickly we began to see the impacts of this invasion here at home at places like the gas pump. And even more troublesome, we began to hear the first serious talk of nuclear war in almost 60 years! That certainly got my attention and reminded me of how sin has just ruined this world. Which is why Easter can’t get here fast enough this year.

Almost everyone knows that Easter is a joyous time of year. However, it seems that few people know the real reason behind that joy. Now we might think that this type of ignorance applies only to those whose shadow has never darkened a church pew on Easter morning. But the fact of the matter is that those who attend the services of God’s house and are acquainted with His Word often know the joy of Christmas, but fail to see the joy of our Lord’s resurrection.

More than just an end to the season of Lent or Winter; more than the arrival of Spring and warmer weather; Easter shows us that Christ’s state of humiliation and suffering is over, the truth of His Word is confirmed, and because He has risen our bodies will rise from the grave as well. But while all of that is certainly true, none of it is the real source of Easter joy. For Christ could have easily been glorified in another way. And Christ’s Word was shown to be true by His miracles. And the resurrection of the dead was shown to be true with the Widow of Nain, Jairus’ daughter, and Lazarus. And we must not forget that some, those who have rejected Christ, will be raised as well, but

raised to eternal death.

So, the true joy of Easter is something completely different and gives great comfort in difficult times. The apostle Paul says in I Corinthians 15:17-20: *And if Christ has not been raised, your faith is futile and you are still in your sins. Then those also who have fallen asleep in Christ have perished. If in Christ we have hope in this life only, we are of all people most to be pitied. But in fact Christ has been raised from the dead, the firstfruits of those who have fallen asleep.* Because Christ has risen from the grave we and the rest of the world who trust in Him are no longer in our sin. We have been saved from sin and death! C.F.W. Walther says Christ’s resurrection is not only a stone in the building of our salvation, but the keystone of it. Jesus rising from the grave is not a jewel in the crown of our redemption, but the crown itself.

If Christ had not been raised from the dead, Paul tells us that Christians would be pitied more than any other group of people. But the fact of the matter is, Christ is risen! Therefore, regardless of what troubles we face, regardless of the manifestations of sin that we see in the world or even in our own lives, regardless of how close we come to standing at the graves of loved ones or even in our own—we have hope and peace. Because Easter is like turning to the last few pages in the story of our lives and seeing how they end. And Paul tells us that because Jesus lives, we will live as well. Not a miserable existence in a sinful world. But because of the resurrection, Christ’s victory over sin and the grave will be our own as we’ll live with Him in the blessed eternity of His redeemed creation.

May your Easter celebrations here at Bethany, or wherever God brings you, give you this Easter peace and joy this year and forever.

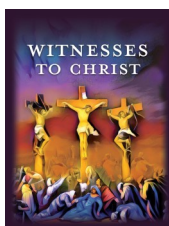

Bethany Lutheran Food Pantry has been open for 42 weeks. To date, 287 households have been served. With the return of pre-pandemic SNAP (Supplemental Nutrition Assistance Program) benefits on April 1, we anticipate seeing an increase in the number of neighbors seeking help.



Bethany Lutheran Food Pantry is open to anyone in need, every Sunday 1:00-3:00 p.m. Each Sunday we need six people to greet and assist our neighbors who visit the pantry. Bethany volunteers are also needed to pick up food from HACAP, deliver to Bethany, and stock the shelves every Friday. Contact Nurse Ronda if you would like to help with this.

**Want to donate?** Items always needed at the pantry are general household and personal care items such as toilet paper, paper towels, liquid hand soap, laundry detergent, shampoo, and tissues.

## Project 24: Christ's Care for Children in Kenya

Project 24 is a Lutheran mission located in Kenya that Bethany started supporting in May 2021. On March 27 the Board of Evangelism hosted an event to share updates about Project 24 and to announce our plan to continue support of this mission. Last spring we set the goal to raise \$10,000 in one year. Our church went above and beyond and has raised \$10,787 to date. With a \$797 kickstart, **our new goal is to raise an additional \$10,000 this year!**

The children in the Project 24 program receive a Christian education in a safe environment while living in the boarding facilities. In addition to their physical, medical, and spiritual needs being met, students learn essential life skills that prepare them for life beyond Project 24.

## Family Promise



In 2018, Bethany became a host congregation for Family Promise of Linn County, an organization that provides shelter, meals, and support services to families that are homeless. Family Promise partners with local faith communities to make these services possible. When the program started, congregations would take turns signing up for weeks to host families within their facilities. During the weeks that Bethany hosted families, Bethany members volunteered to provide food, host meal times, and stay overnight with the families at Bethany. When the pandemic started, Family Promise staff continued to work on homelessness prevention, but the hosting program was put on hold.

This spring, Family Promise of Linn County will resume hosting families with the help of congregations. However, the format will look a little different. Family Promise is transitioning from a **rotational model** (where the family would move to a different church each week) to a **static model** (families stay in the same place, and congregations sign up for weeks to take turns volunteering at that site).

Family Promise of Linn County is now permanently stationed at St. Stephen's Lutheran Church on 31st Street SE. The facility is set up with an office space, family rooms, a kitchen, and—with the help of Bethany Lutheran Church—a shower and laundry area. As a host congregation, when it is our week to serve, instead of hosting at Bethany, our volunteers would do the same thing we were doing before, but at the St. Stephen's location.

We are hoping to have enough willing volunteers to serve in this way so we can once again be a host congregation. If you are interested in cooking and hosting meals, or staying overnight with families at Family Promise at St. Stephen's, please contact Ronda at nurse.bethanycr@gmail.com or 319-364-6026. When we know we have enough willing volunteers, we will be able to sign up for a week to serve.

...after you find a pink slip with your final paycheck.

...after your family and friends have heard your story one too many times, but you still need to talk it out.

Please set aside enough time (about 30-60 minutes) to answer all the questions, as the online assessment must be completed in one sitting. The program will not allow you to stop and return to finish later. **If you cannot complete the survey online, please contact the church office for a paper copy.**

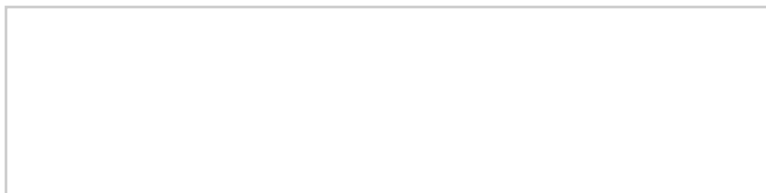
## Traditional Music Ministry
