PASTOR'S PAGE

As we celebrate Stewardship and Reformation Sundays this month, I thought you might enjoy these thoughts from The LC-MS Stewardship Ministry. Enjoy!

In the early morning hours of Feb. 18, 1546, Martin Luther closed his eyes forever. Before that happened, the hand that hammered the 95 Theses into the door of the Castle Church in Wittenberg on Oct. 31, 1517, penned its final words: "We are all beggars. This is true." And this is the truth that our Lord says makes you free.

Ironic, isn't it? In order to be free, you must be a beggar. You must be utterly dependent and reliant upon God. This makes us uncomfortable – the way we're uncomfortable when someone gets us a Christmas present when we haven't gotten them one. We feel we owe them. And we don't like being in someone's debt like that.

But what Luther would remind us is that we are all indeed beggars. And we're not just anyone's beggars. We're God's beggars. Christ came for sinners. He came to seek and save the lost. He came to heal the sick and raise the dead. He came for sinners, and He dwells only with sinners.

If we are to be where He is, we must be willing to be counted among the lost, the sick, and the dead. We must be willing to be beggars. We must cry out for mercy, for grace, and for his undeserved love and kindness. We must be dependent solely on Him and what He gives.

And here's the beauty: He gives us everything. Everything. Forgiveness of sins, salvation from death and the devil, and eternal life. This isn't because of any worthiness or merit in us. It is because of His divine goodness, mercy, and grace. On

account of Christ's death and resurrection, the Father forgives you, saves you, and is pleased with you. You receive His love, His righteousness, His holiness, His acceptance, and His inheritance. We are all beggars. This is true.

This is the heart and soul of Christianity and the lifeblood of the Christian Church. God justifies us and declares us innocent and righteous by His grace received through faith for the sake of Christ. This isn't because of our works but because of His work on the cross. We, who once were enemies of God, are reconciled to Him and made to be His children.

This is what Luther pointed us to when He took up his pen for the last time and scribbled "We are all beggars. This is true." We are beggars, but we are beggars of the God who does not ignore us and who doesn't pass by us on the other side. We are beggars of the One who descended from heaven to make His dwelling with sinners.

We are beggars of Him who deigns to dwell with us, among us, and – yes – still in us by grace for Christ's sake. For in the bread and cup that we bless we share together with Christ and each other the riches of God's grace. The riches of this grace – the Gospel in sermon and absolution, in Baptism, and in Holy Communion – are so inexhaustible that our cups overflow. We, who are God's beggars, are inexhaustibly satisfied, and we have something to give back in thanksgiving and praise.





On Sunday, October 2 we will join Lutheran churches around the world in celebrating LWML Sunday. The theme for LWML Sunday 2022 is "For Us and With Us." Since 1942 the Lutheran Women's Missionary League has affirmed each woman's identi-

ty as a child of God and her relationship with Jesus Christ, encouraging and equipping Christian women to live out their lives in active mission ministries, and to support missions around the world through their gifts of mites, tithes, offerings, and service. On October 2 see the LWML display in the Gathering Area to learn more about ways to be involved in the women's guild. Please bring your mites that day to support LWML district and national mission grants.



What's Happening at Bethany Lutheran Food Pantry?

We've been open now for 15 months. Do we notice a need in the community?

Yes! In the first year we served over 360 families. Since July 2022 we have served over 275 families. Some of these families have come one time, and many visit the pantry multiple times. The last Sunday of September we had a record food pantry attendance of 97 households. If you add up everyone living within those households, there were over 380 neighbors helped that day!

Wow, the need is great! What can I donate?

Bethany Lutheran Food Pantry requests donations of personal care and household cleaning items such as: Laundry detergent, dish soap, tissues, paper towels, toilet paper, hand soap, shampoo, conditioner, body wash, deodorant, toothbrushes, and toothpaste.

What about food?

We ask for personal care and cleaning items because most food is purchased through our partnership with HACAP. We are able to purchase food at a VERY discounted cost through HACAP. Each week anywhere from 400 to 1,700 pounds of food is picked up by Bethany volunteers and unloaded and stocked on the shelves at Bethany. Farmers Hen House in Kalona has been generously donating 135 dozen eggs twice a month! Thank you to all the Bethany volunteers who drive to Kalona and pick up the boxes of eggs! If you are a coupon shopper or Hy-Vee Hot Deals shopper and you find a GREAT deal on a food item, we would gladly accept those donations.

I'd love to get involved. What else can I do?

Each Sunday we need six volunteers to staff the food pantry at 12:30-3:00 p.m. To volunteer, please sign up online at **www.bethanycr.org/food-pantry**. If you would like to know more about the pantry, Nurse Ronda would be glad to talk about any part of the pantry and/or give you a tour.

Monday Morning Outreach

On Mondays during the school year we set up a tent out front to serve free coffee and cocoa to Washington High School students and any neighbors who stop by. This outreach is very well received by the community! Each Monday we need volunteers at 6:30-8:00 a.m. to help serve warm drinks and smiles.
