On October 7th, terrorists attacked the nation of Israel, killing over a thousand men, women, and children and taking hostage hundreds more. In the days following, the details of this attack have come to light and the world has watched Israel respond by declaring war on the terrorist organization that committed these crimes. All of this has brought many ideas and opinions concerning Israel and the Middle East out into the light, and questions about war and violence to arise in the church. The following are a few observations to address some of those opinions and questions.

First, among Martin Luther's 28 theses during the Heidelberg Disputation was this: "A theology of glory calls evil good and good evil. A theology of the cross calls the thing what it actually is." primarily concerned with the work of Christ for our salvation, this thesis can be applied to life in general, including what happened to Israel. seems that because so many people today have been taught that "acceptance" is the most important virtue to be practiced, people have lost the ability or will to call evil what it is - evil. If we believe that everyone's choices and behaviors as equally acceptable as any other, then we are be left with people celebrating, defending, and making excuses for the massacre of innocent people at a music festival today and only who knows what tomorrow.

Second, it should be noted that the present-day nation state of Israel, is not same as Israel in the Old Testament. In an excellent article titled Whose Land Is It that can be found in the November 2006 edition of the Lutheran Witness (contact me for a copy or the link) Dr. Reed Lessing notes, "When the New Testament is allowed to interpret the Old Testament, it follows that the 1948 state of Israel is not a prophetic realization of the Messianic kingdom of Jesus Christ. His Kingdom is not of this world (John 18:36)". Therefore, God's covenant to Abraham was not an "everlasting land grant to the Jews". Rather the true children of Abraham are baptized Christians (Romans 9:6-8),

and the promises made to Abraham were realized through Christ (Galatians 3:16). And Christians are not to put their hope in a strip of land, but in Christ alone.

Which leads to my third and final point. Jesus tells us in John 16:33b, "... In the world you will have tribulation. But take heart; I have overcome the world." As terrible as the recent events in Israel and Gaza have been, we all know that this type of war and death is nothing new. Whether it be terrorist attacks in Israel or New York City, violence between Jews and Palestinians or Cain and Abel; sin has been manifesting itself through violence and death for generations and will continue to do so. But Christians find hope in the midst of this tribulation, not in the strength of a military force or in a one or a two-state solution, but in the strength and love of our Lord and Savior. To be sure, God has given us governments and militaries to bless and protect people of every time and place. But the only solution for sin and death is the saving work of Jesus Christ.

And so, as rockets continue to be launched and bombs continue to fall in Israel and Gaza, let us make sure that our own lives are in order. We may not have any control over the relationship between Israel and Palestine, but you certainly have your relationships with control over neighbors, be them Jews, Arabs, or any other ethnicity. If you deplore the treatment of one group by another, then make sure no one is able to deplore your treatment of anyone. But also, let us pray to God for peace. Let us pray that the innocent may be saved, that evil be brought to justice, and all sides may be brought to repentance and faith. Because God's Word is clear that we are all sinners living in a troubled world, but Jesus Christ has overcome this world and gives those who trust in Him salvation and hope for tomorrow.

## **Updates from Bethany Lutheran Food Pantry**

#### **GRANT FOR A FREEZER**

We are excited to share that Bethany Lutheran Food Pantry was awarded a \$1,000 grant from the Transamerica Foundation to purchase a second freezer for the pantry. It will arrive November 2 and will be placed in the room next to the pantry. Having this freezer will allow us to secure a greater volume of frozen food from HACAP (Hawkeye Area Community Action Program) to share with pantry neighbors!

#### **PARTNERSHIPS**

- HACAP Food Reservoir shared our annual distribution summary. Because of our partnership with HACAP this past year we were able to pick up 64,651 pounds of food at the cost of \$6,254. The total value of food that we got from HACAP equaled \$113,116. This is a cost savings of \$106,862! Twice a week, Pete Larson and his platoon of volunteers pick up an average of 1,278 pounds of food for our pantry. We pay an average of \$122.60 each week for that food.
- Our partnership with **Feed Iowa First** has provided an abundance of fresh vegetables for our pantry neighbors. We have wonderful volunteers who help weekly in Bethany's own garden.
- Our partnership with **Farmer's Hen House** in Kalona provides 270 dozen eggs each month, and Bethany volunteers pick up eggs in Kalona bimonthly.
- Days for Girls provides washable, reusable feminine hygiene kits for our neighbors.
- Mt. Mercy University senior nursing students have volunteered their hours in the pantry to complete their capstone project.

#### **FUN FACTS**

- As of the end of October 2023, the pantry has been open 124 weeks.
- Each week we have at least ten new households that come to the pantry.
- English is not the primary language for many of our food pantry neighbors.
- Thrivent Action Team dollars can provide needed items for the pantry at no cost to the member. (See Linda Patten or Lissa Novitch for details about Thrivent Action Teams).



#### **HOW CAN I HELP?**

- **Donate! Potatoes** (of any kind -- sweet, russet, canned or mashed, you name it!) are the food pantry item of the month for November.
- Household and personal care items that are needed include: toilet paper, tissues, laundry pods, laundry dryer sheets, small dish detergent, deodorant, shampoo, bar soap, and 13-gallon trash bags.
- **Volunteer!** Each Sunday we need six volunteers from 12:30 to 3:00 to have the pantry run smoothly. Sign up to volunteer at bethanyer.org/food-pantry

#### Thrivent Action Teams

Have you ever wanted to help Bethany Lutheran Food Pantry but aren't sure what the pantry needs? If you are a member of Thrivent Financial you can make a huge difference and it won't cost you a dime. If you are not sure what the pantry needs, just give your Thrivent cash card that will be sent to you to the church office, and we will shop for you. Thrivent allows you to apply for two grants per year. What a blessing this is to our pantry neighbors!






## **Greene Square Outreach Ministry**




## Joy's Journal

## **Especially For You Race**

A record-setting 16,546 people registered for the 33rd annual Especially for You® Race Against Breast Cancer, which took place on October 1 at Mercy Medical Center. This year's race exceeded the previous record of 15,800 participants in 2022. Bethany had a team of 12 this year.

Proceeds from race registrations benefit the Especially for You fund. This year, more than \$531,147 in registrations was raised for the fund, which provides financial assistance for breast and gynecological cancer screenings and services for area individuals in need. Since its inception, the EFY fund has helped more than 13,300 individuals with 35,600 services right here in Linn County.

#### **Blood Drive: Thank You!**

The American Red Cross held a blood drive at Bethany on October 13. Thank you to everyone who helped save lives by donating blood! We collected 25 units of blood at this drive. Another drive will be held in April.


