

Pastor's Page

On Wednesday evenings our Director of Christian Education (Kierra) and I have been leading a small study on the book *Principles of Biblical Interpretation for Everyone* by Dr. James Voelz. In a section of the book called "The Impact of the Divine Nature and Attributes of Sacred Scripture" Dr. Voelz writes the following:

"The confession of the early church is that the second person of the Trinity, fully God, took on human flesh, but he did so in such a way that it preserved his true and full humanity. His two natures are united, in the words of the Council of Chalcedon, "unconfusedly, unchangeably, indivisibly, inseparably" and that in such a way that the property of each nature is not destroyed but preserved. In just this way we confess that in the sacred Scriptures, the thoughts and the words of the Holy Spirit took on human thoughts and words in such a way that the one holy writing has two natures...It is important to note that in both cases (regarding both our Lord and the Scriptures), the divine incarnate unity "looked" absolutely human."


So, in addition to being a human being, Jesus was also true God in every sense. Yet seeing Him, (when He wasn't performing miracles), He looked like an average guy walking around. In the same way, Dr. Voelz writes, the Scriptures have a human and divine nature to them and yet often "look" just like any other human writing, despite being the Word of God.

I think this idea can be applied to many things in the Church (the communion of saints) today, including its mission. Of course, the Church has a human side to it; it is made up of people suffering from and enduring the consequences of sin. But through the Spirit working through the Word and Sacraments, we are forgiven our sin and made children of God. This is not to say that

Christians somehow take upon themselves a divine nature, as Christ took upon Himself our humanity. But when those who have been redeemed by Christ work in His name, there is a divine element to all of these humans are doing.

Therefore, when the world sees a van of teenagers and chaperones driving out to Denver (all looking perfectly human), Christians can actually see God Himself at work using these people to share His love with the people of Denver. Monday mornings, many people may just see a few folks in Bethany's kitchen making sandwiches or on Tuesday mornings the world may only see a few people handing out those sandwiches to our friends and neighbors downtown. But in these actions, Christians see God at work, providing daily bread, prayers and fellowship to nourish both the body and soul. And when one takes into consideration that it is God who begins and enables all of this work in His Church, there truly seems to be an incarnational aspect to what happens here at Bethany and in the Church around the world.

This is great for Christians to see this divine/human nature of the work in the Church. It is a reminder that the work we do together is important and can also serve to strengthen our resolve when things seem to be a little too human. But even more importantly, I believe the unbelieving world needs to see the divine nature of what humans are doing in the church today. So often we hear people asking, "Where is God these days?" I hope and pray that they will be able to see God in that van going to Denver, in the lunch bags handed out downtown, and in the countless other activities and ministries that are taking place at Bethany and in God's Church throughout His creation.

Joy's Journal



During my shift I almost always touch 80-90 lives. A couple times it's even been a few over 100. I get lots of pets and love on Friday afternoons! Some of the nurses' stations even have dog treats for me -- I can remember which ones they are and I'm extra cute when I visit those nurses! I also hand out mini Joys to patients and nurses, which include my business card that has my bible verse and Bethany's contact information. To God be the glory! Bethany Lutheran Food Pantry Updates

How many neighbors use Bethany Lutheran Food Pantry?

Bethany Lutheran Food Pantry is serving our neighbors! An average of 84 households visited the pantry in February, March, April and May (and within those households, an average of 324 people received food each week). On Sunday, June 23, we had a record 101 neighbors that came to the pantry and they took food home to 395 people in their households!

How can I serve in the pantry?

Each Sunday we need seven volunteers to serve at the pantry from 12:30-3:00 p.m. There are a variety of tasks such as checking neighbors in, and helping neighbors shop. If you are interested in assisting in the pantry, contact Nurse Ronda at nurse.bethanycr@gmail.com and visit bethanycr.org/food-pantry to sign up. Each week Pete Larson oversees the volunteers that pick up food at HACAP in Hiawatha and stock our shelves. Contact Nurse Ronda if you would like to join the Friday pickup and stocking team!

How are we seeing God at work in the lives of our pantry neighbors? How can I pray?

We are taking prayer requests from our pantry neighbors. A pantry neighbor recently shared that they had had cancer, but is now cancer free! Another neighbor shared that she is still living in her car and is in great need of a place to live.



What's happening in the garden?


The food grown in the garden near the back entrance will be shared with the pantry neighbors. The zucchinis are about ready! We will also be getting vegetables from other Feed Iowa First local gardens to share in the pantry. Sweet peppers, squash, zucchini, peas and basil plants are all growing! Thank you to Sheryl Knutson, Lynn Madsen and others for tending the Bethany garden!

What can I donate in July?

The pantry is in great need of toilet paper. The Board of Evangelism challenges the congregation to donate 400 rolls of toilet paper in the month of July! Since we have close to 100 neighbors coming through the pantry each week, 400 rolls would be enough for each neighbor to take one roll per week during the month of July. Add toilet paper to your shopping list and help us stock the pantry shelves!







Foundations in Personal Finance

A personal finance class for young adults (high school and college age) will be offered at Bethany this fall. "Foundations in Personal Finance" is designed to teach young adults money skills to use now and the rest of their lives. This course is part of Dave Ramsey's very successful program.


