# Pastor's Page

My first call into parish ministry was to a church in Pennsylvania. And while my church was located in the north-east part of the state (or commonwealth), we were not too far away from, and would often vacation in, south-central Pennsylvania – where there was a large Amish community. You probably know that the Amish are famous for many things, including their rejection of many modern-day technologies. So, visiting the areas where the Amish lived it was common to see horse and buggies going down the road, horses being used to plow the fields, and kids using reel mowers to cut the grass.

When I would see things like this, I had always assumed the Amish rejected modern technology because they looked upon it as sinful or able to lead one into temptation. I also wondered why they would seemingly adopt technology from the 1800's, but not the 20th or 21st centuries. But recently I attended a lecture in St. Louis titled, Resisting a Post-Human Future that shed new light for me about the Amish's views on technology that I think can actually be helpful for many people.

In this lecture, Dr. C. Ben Mitchell said that when looking at how to use technology, the Amish first begin by defining the things they value most in life. This might include things like faith, family, and community. Then, after they have this clearly defined, they will ask if adopting new technologies are "worth it". In short, they don't ask if things will make their lives more efficient or even easier. They ask if things will help them to live the kind of lives that they want to live. Much of the technology from the 1800's can do that for the Amish, while many of modern-day our conveniences will not.

Putting this into practice in our lives means that we don't just blindly buy the newest gadget because it is faster, smaller (or bigger), flashier, or makes us more efficient than the one that we already have. Instead, we ask ourselves, "What do I want my life to look like with my children or grandchildren? My parents or my neighbors? What role do I want to have in my community and in my church? What do I want my relationship to

be with God and His people?" Only after answering these questions, and others like them that are relevant in your life, can you begin to ask if that new phone, or new television, or new car is "worth it". That is, ask if that new technology you are thinking of bringing into your life will actually help you live the life that you want.

Of course, there is a danger in defining what we want our lives to be like and using that to determine how we live and what kind of technology we use. For instance, one could say, "I want my neighbors to be jealous of all the stuff I have." Or "I want to have a life where my family and friends do whatever I tell them!" (I think we can all see where this would lead!) And so, we must let our desires be shaped by the Good News of our Risen Lord, Jesus Christ.

Knowing that God has given His only Son to die for us on the cross in order that our sins can be forgiven, impacts every part of a Christian's life. It not only gives us peace and hope as we face the future, but it also shapes our thoughts, as well as our actions in the here and now. This is why Jesus is able to teach His disciples that in order to be great in His Kingdom, they must be servants. Wanting to define your relationship with others in this "serving" way and letting it guide your decisions into the future is really only possible when you know what God has done for you through His Son, Jesus.

So, while I am not looking to trade-in any of the family vehicles for a horse and buggy any time soon, I do plan to be a little more intentional in thinking about how new technology helps me to live the life I want, and I would encourage you to consider doing the same. And as Christians, let your faith in Jesus Christ, who has freely given you eternal life through His death and resurrection, shape what you want your life to look like today and tomorrow.

# **LWML**


The LWML (Women's Guild) is looking forward to a number of activities in October. Join us at these events this month to learn more about the Lutheran Women's Missionary League!
