Bethany Living and Sharing God's Love

Pastor's Page

Late this summer I rediscovered my love of mountain biking—that is, riding my bike off the roads and paved trails and on dirt or gravel paths through the woods. However, with summer coming to a close and the amount of daylight getting shorter and shorter, I realized that the time I have to ride each day is also getting shorter. So, after reading several articles online about how much fun it is to mountain bike at night, I decided to purchase a headlight for my bike. My thinking was that if I can't go out riding the trails when the sun is up, I'd buy a light that would allow me to ride whenever I want, greatly increasing the amount of time I have each day to enjoy riding.

Getting my new light I charged up the battery, mounted it (on my helmet actually), and waited for the first day when I couldn't go out riding during the daylight hours. When that day came, I rode out to the trailhead, turned the light on, and had a great time pedaling through the woods. Much to my delight the new light was nice and bright. It let me easily see where the trail was and where it was going. Any obstacles like tree roots or rocks were easily seen so I could zip around or even over them. Even the parts of the trail that were a bit sandy were easily discernable so I would know to slow down or take it easy around the corner.

Riding along in the dark like this, I couldn't help but to think of Psalm 119:105, "Your word is a lamp to my feet and a light to my path." It is no surprise to any of us that the world can often seem like a dark place. The evil and sin that surround us can easily hide the path God desires us to travel in life. And even when we know that path, such as God's Ten Commandments, there are countless obstacles that seemingly come out of nowhere that tempt us to stumble and fall. But the Holy Spirit uses God's Word as a bright light to break the darkness in which we live. Not only do the Scriptures show us the path God would have us travel in life, it points out the difficulties in staying on that path and stumbling blocks that may cause us to trip and fall. And of course, best of all, unlike my bike light that can't help me much if do go off the trail and crash, God's Word shows us our Savior, Jesus Christ, who gave His life to forgive all of our sin, so we may have life should we stumble and fall.

As I reached the end of the trail during my ride and pedaled back to our house, I was somewhat surprised to find that I didn't enjoy the ride as much as I thought I would. My light worked out fine, better than expected actually, and it felt good to get some

exercise on a day when I otherwise would not have. But the problem I discovered was that even with my light showing me the way to go, it was still kind of scary riding out in the woods in the dark. Yes, the light showed me where the trail was, but it also showed me several sets of eyes along the side of the trail that were glowing back at me. (Were those raccoons, or something more dangerous?) And while I could see the rocks and tree roots on the trail, I couldn't see what that noise was over off to my side. I think it was a deer, but do they have mountain lions in Iowa? And was that heat lightning or is a storm coming in? Or what if I get a flat tire or the battery dies in my new light?!?! I couldn't help but to think of all these things as I rode along and that made the ride not as much fun as normal. But, if I had another rider along with me, I think I would have enjoyed riding in the dark much, much more. An extra set of eyes looking out for apex predators (or bunny rabbits) would be comforting. If the battery on my light died out, we could follow another's. And just having someone else along is helpful should anything go wrong.

I think the same can be said for reading and studying God's Word. Yes, in the dark and evil world in which we live, we all can and should spend time reading the Bible alone and in doing so the Spirit blesses us with all of the gifts God promises. But sometimes, for various reasons, it's nice to have someone else along as the light of God's Word lightens our path. This is why we are blessed to have so many opportunities to study the Holy Scriptures together at Bethany. From Sunday School to Confirmation and Youth Group; from the Men's and Women's Bible Studies to Monday Evening and Thursday Morning Bible Studies and others, there are plenty of opportunities for us to grow together in the Word. As you read this month's Beacon, I pray that you'll learn more about these opportunities and consider taking advantage of them if you aren't already. Because God's Word is a lamp to our feet and a light to our paths, but I believe it's often nice to go down those paths together!




Women's Small Group Study


